The regular monthly meeting of the Dillsboro Town Council was opened by President, Tom Wafford, with the pledge to the flag on October 10, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.

Council members present: Tom Wafford, Doug Baker, Becky Fryman and Tim Benning. Attorney present: John Watson. Election Council Candidates present: Charlie Caldwell and Jamie Craig.

Clerk-Treasurer - in absentia

- Minutes from the last meeting were reviewed. A motion was made by CM Fryman and seconded by CM Benning to approve. Carried.
- Special Meeting Minutes were reviewed. A motion was made by CM Benning and seconded by CM Fryman to approve. Carried.
- Sewer adjustments were requested for Jennell Scudder at 12042 Old US 50 for a faucet leak in the amount of \$43.77 and Gina Wuellner at 9750 Front Street for a water leak between house and meter in the amount of \$73.30. A motion was made to approve the adjustments by CM Fryman and seconded by CM Benning. Approved.

Utility Department - Matt Bauer

- In regards to the US 50 Waterline Project, approximately 6000 feet is completed. Nearing the end of US 50 Line, no customers will be without service during the connection.
- Aurora wants to replace their bulk meter pit next year.
- O'Mara will be patching soon. There will be a few more repairs added to the list due to recent additional water line repairs.
- The Utilities crew has repaired several leaks and new fire hydrants are being installed to flush lines.
- The start of the Water Meter project is still unknown. Work will begin as soon as supplies are received.
- The Water Tank is still not in service. A Hydrant and valve below the tank must be replaced. Holman will provide the materials and labor so it can be added to the SRLF.

- Water Tower Dillsboro Main Street is proposing Solar-powered LED spotlights on the tower.
- Dearborn County Foundation Endowment Matching Program. The Town has received confirmation of the \$5000 match from the Foundation for the Quality of Life Endowment
- Grass Ordinance Enforcement tabled until spring. Town will engage an insured lawn care service that will agree to contract for mowing when called.

- Drug and Alcohol Testing Policy Motion was made by CM Fryman and seconded by CM Benning to approve. Passed.
- Highway 50 INDOT ROW's -Jamie Renner, Clearing Project Manager, spoke with Tony McClellan and asked about the R/W fence. He said that INDOT will remove it. Additionally, they will:
- Finish the current clearing agreement (Currently they are about 6 working days from the clearing being completed on the South side of US 50).
 - o Schedule and complete a walkthrough of the south side clearing and discuss any areas of concern.
 - Set a tentative date to come back and remove R/W fence.
 - o Talk through the timing of the detail work of spraying, seeding, re-spraying.
 - o Fall 2023 set up a plan of attack for clearing the North side of US 50.
 - o There is quite a bit of detail work that will need done based on the time of year, i.e. seeding, spraying, re-seeding and spraying again. INDOT will stay on top of the spraying, especially in the first couple of years to have a very nice looking turf r/w.

<u>Legal – John Watson</u>

Bulk Sewer Treatment Agreement – Dearborn County Commissioners are discussing funding for Dearborn County Regional Sewer District: Lake Dilldear Extension Project. Their attorney has prepared a draft agreement. We will need to establish a rate which must be fair and just. Additionally, we need to consider the ability to do sewer liens, Article 6.01 should include approval by the utility department and Town Council. Discussions need to be had concerning forced connections and when and how rates may be increased. We will schedule a meeting with Curry & Associates, Eric Graver, Matt Bauer, John Watson and Council to discuss the topic indepth.

- Jennifer Street the street is no longer blocked. John Watson will discuss with Jennell Scudder the ability to create a turn around.
- 12227 Rullman We must have another inspection for a destruct order in order to move forward.
