Visit St. John's Old Brick School

St. John's Lutheran School in Farmers Retreat, was built in 1888. Through its doors passed children in search of secular and religious training. From 1888 to 1950, the walls resounded with the voices and vibrations of youth, but have long since been silenced by changing times. Twelve called and ordained teachers served the sixty-two years classes were held. This building was vacated at the completion of the newer school in 1950. The building has been restored and staged as a museum. The public is welcome to a free tour each Sunday afternoon September and October 2:00 to 4:00 PM. 

Dillsboro Heritage Festival

September 21-22, 2019



The theme for the 2019 Heritage Festival is Transportation of Yester Years.

*In 1742 a certain Mr. Howard blazed a trail from Norfolk, Virginia to what is now Dearborn County. Hence began the push westward.

*The Ohio and Mississippi Railway was a railroad operating between Cincinnati, Ohio, and East St. Louis, Illinois, from 1857 to 1893. It merged in 1893 with the Baltimore and Ohio Southwestern Railway, and is now part of CSX Transportation's Indiana Subdivision. The Dillsboro Station was located just north of town off of Station Hollow Road.

*John Lenover ran a daily omnibus travelling on the Aurora-Laughery Turnpike from Dillsborough to Aurora in 1850. This system was the earliest public transportation between the two towns.

* "Dillsborough is noted for roads..there being no less than seven or eight public roads crossing or terminating at this place...." - taken from an article entitled "Roads" in the mid 1850's



Trolleys will be available for transport from parking to main events at regular intervals. Transportation will run from 9-4 on Saturday and 8:30 am-7:00 pm on Sunday. Maps will be available at businesses and trolley stops throughout town.
